#### Meetings with Campus Trust

I had a Campus Trust meeting in late April to discuss our existing benefits and establish the fees for the upcoming academic year for the health and dental plans available to STU students. Along with the two Campus Trust representatives, our general manager Tina, our former president Alex, and our former vice president administration Minahil attended the meeting to review the renewal report and provide input on what the fee for the upcoming academic year 2023–2024 should be. The conversation was on how we had broken even this year and would need to moderately raise the fees to maintain the trend so that the covered benefits could expand the next year. After that, on May 4<sup>th</sup>, I met with Owen, a Campus Trust representative, to receive some training about the non-for-profit structure that allows to offer a viable alternative to typical student health and dental plans. Finally, we discussed some ideas for the Campus Trust's Assembly of Participating Organizations (APO) that will take place in June.

#### **SEC Meeting**

On May 9 and May 22, the executives met to go through our plans for advocacy this year and identify the main priorities that each executive would be focusing on during the academic year while keeping in mind our strategic plan. We also discussed about a sponsorship letter from the Cultural Expressions Festival.

#### **Completed the STUSU Employment Process**

The STUSU completed the hiring process for the academic year 2023-2024. However, two positions are still vacant, and the team would open the hiring process in the coming months before classes start. I have created a contact list of our employees and shared it with our General Manager.

#### **Academic Assistance Applications**

The SEC reviewed one academic assistance application from a student.

#### Contacted SRC Reps 2022-23 for their Honorarium

I contacted representatives to offer them an honorarium in accordance with our operational policies and to express our gratitude for completing their responsibilities as SRC representatives and for their work and effort over the previous academic year.

#### Prepare SRC Representatives & Employees email account

I reached out to IT services to reset the email accounts of representatives and employees in preparation for the incoming council and employees. Except for the Activities Coordinator, who will remain with us for the upcoming academic year, this was done for all accounts.

#### Introduction to Senior and Lower Admin

I sent out introductions to the senior and lower admin team. I am planning to send my introduction to the President as soon as he assumes his role in July.

#### **Students Inquiry on Campus Trust**

I received and answered some emails from students experiencing issues with their Student Benefits account, while others requested more information on the Health & Dental Plans.

#### Upcoming - Campus Trust's Assembly of Participating Organizations (APO)

Our General Manager Tina and I will travel to the Campus Trust conference in June, which will be held in PEI with the majority of the costs and expenses covered by Campus Trust.

The Canadian Alliance of Student Association (CASA) is a non-partisan, not for profit advocacy organization centered around student advocacy, federal policy, consisting of post-secondary institutions across the country. CASA serves as our federal advocacy partner, and I serve as the primary delegate for the union.

### **CASA Information Sessions:**

In preparation for the upcoming foundations conference in Ottawa, I attended two introductory meetings held by CASA outlining what is CASA as well as the process of the upcoming Board and Committee Elections.

### **CASA Foundations Conference:**

The following week, the SU President and I travelled to Ottawa from May 14-20<sup>th</sup> to attend the Foundations conference to introduce the work of CASA and upcoming federal advocacy as well as create strong connections with other student union representatives.

### New Brunswick Student Alliance (NBSA)

The New Brunswick Student Alliance (NBSA) is a provincial advocacy partner rather than federal consisting of post-secondaries across the province, advocating for NB students. As VP Education, I am also the primary delegate for the NBSA, and I am looking forward to working closely with the NBSA for the upcoming year.

### NBSA Transition Conference:

At the end of the month the SU President and I attended the NBSA Foundations conference, getting to know the incoming executive board from other NB student

unions as well as introduce the work of NBSA and our priorities and projects for the upcoming year. I was elected chair of the NBSA at this meeting and welcomed the new incoming Vice-chair from Mount Allison.

There is an executive meeting scheduled the last week of May to discuss the upcoming policy and strategic planning retreat in June.
