#### Meeting w/ National Indigenous Advocacy Committee

During this meeting we began discussing our upcoming NIAC retreat, this retreat will be hosted in Smokey Lake, Alberta and NIAC members will be able to come together, participate in workshops that will build upon their advocacy skills along with providing a few extra tools for our upcoming advocacy week. We will also receive traditional teachings by elders, participate in medicine walks and indulge in traditional cuisine. During this meeting, our committee met with three Government of Canada employees who specialize in the Student Financial Assistance Program. We had a long chat about being an Indigenous person in PSE along with the berries we continue to face when it comes to funding.

#### Meeting w/ Welcome Week Chair

During this meeting we had a few discussions about welcome week events, but this meeting was dedicated to checking up on the ww chair. These meetings will occasionally be dedicated to work but this one was a touch-base/check-in.

# Meeting with National Indigenous Advocacy Committee & Students' Association of MacEwan University

This meeting was dedicated to ensuring opening communication between MacEwan University and the National Indigenous Advocacy Committee. We discussed the process of becoming a NIAC member along with answering some questions they had about the committee.

## Meeting w/ Welcome Week Chair & VP Student Life

During this meeting we began planning the STUSU Welcome Week events. While we obviously haven't completed all planning, we were able to create a schedule that will ensure our group stays on track and we can get all our events planned by the end of the summer.

## Meeting w/ Parliamentary Member Jennica Atwin

During this meeting, NIAC chairs discussed our federal advocacy asks. The Post-Secondary Student Support Program (PSSSP) was our first item of discussion, we shared data around how many Indigenous students are eligible for PSE compared to how many are supported by the program; this program is being pushed since PSSSP is meant to sunset at the end of 2023 and the Federal Government has not said if the program will be staying or going. Our second ask was surrounding the Indigenous Skills and Employment Training Program, we discussed the implications of this program and how it goes directly against self-determination by prescribing specific programs to students. Meeting with MP Atwin is always amazing, and this meeting was no different!!
